Who We Are and What We Aim to Achieve

We organise international orchestra courses aiming at connecting young people through music. These courses bring together young people from different European nations to rehearse and perform symphonic and chamber music works. In addition to improving musical skills, we promote intercultural exchange between the participants and our audiences. Once a year we meet in a European country and rehearse a programme which is performed in three or four concerts, most often in regions that are rarely visited by symphonic orchestras.

The relationships between the participants are enriched and deepened by a colourful and enter-taining cultural programme, which is planned for and carried out by the participants. The enthusiasm of the young musicians and their passion for music create the joyful atmosphere of the course and the overwhelmingly positive ence.

We are a charitable organisation based in Germany. The board consists of former participants and tutors combining the expertise of students, artists, and scientists from different countries. We are working on a voluntary basis, united by our passion of connecting cultures through music.

About the Course

Over the years, BISYOC was held in seven countries. By now, close to 800 young musicians from the age of 16 to 26 from 32 countries have made BISYOC their high-light of the summer. Our course usually takes place at the end of July and the beginning of August and lasts about twelve days. We rehearse a programme of symphonic works and chamber music, supported by a team of international tutors. The rehearsals start as sectionals (flute, viola, etc.) which are soon joined into combined sectionals (strings, woodwinds, etc.) and culminate in the Tutti (large symphony orchestra). The musical programme is accompanied by a diverse cultural programme, such as "International Food Night", "International Dance Night", and field trips. During the last days of the course, several concerts in different formats (symphony orchestra, chamber music, etc.) are performed.
